

DISTRICT 28 MEETING MINUTES

May 2022

OPEN:- DCM Bob M. opened the meeting with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer, the Declaration of Unity and the Responsibility Statement.

ROLL:- There were nine GSRs eligible to vote.

SECRETARY:- Jeanna H. read the minutes of the previous meeting. They were accepted.

TREASURER:- Dave D. gave a report and a copy is attached. Dave's report will be submitted for audit at year's end. The closing balance was \$7,887.26.

ARCHIVES:- Dean B. has recovered and is able to resume his work as Archives Chair. Thank you to Denis S. who assumed these duties temporarily. Dean reports that he was able to attend the Area Assembly on Saturday, April 9th in Orlando. He was tasked with manning the Area District History table in the hallway to draw more interest and accessibility to the attendees (as the Area Archives room was buried in a very out-of-the-way location.) Of the number of District Archives in Area 14, there was only one that showed and participated for the District Table: District 28. Dean presented a brief description on District 28 History at the DCM and Panel Members Workshop. He is grateful for the opportunity to share our history.

MEN'S CORRECTIONS:- Bob M. reported that a make-up orientation was held Friday, April 29. Attending this orientation were 7 new recruits: 4 women and 3 men. Including the 7 original men volunteers, the number now comes to 14. They await the completion of background checks and will then be able to begin bringing meetings into the jail.

WEBMASTER:- Steve N. and Brian C. continue to partner together working on improvements to the website. They have kept the website current by posting flyers to download, promoting events on the landing page, and posting the Minutes of the Business Meeting in a timely fashion. A current project includes developing a Version Control system to synchronize changes made to the website by more than one person. They are seeking a less expensive hosting service. A motion was made and passed to increase the storage budget from \$900.00 to \$1,116.00 (a yearly increase of \$216.00) to cover the cost increase.
