\*The new book will not replace our basic text, Alcoholics Anonymous. It will be an accompaniment to it, written in an easier, simplified way.

\*There was a suggestion that groups print out and read the Safety Card for A.A. Groups. (This is F-211 available on the General Service website.) The Safety Card is an optional statement to be read at meetings, this card asks members to refrain from any behavior that may compromise another's safety and encourages all members to take any necessary precautions to ensure their own personal safety.
